

Week 3 of the 'Love in Action' programme is about the Catholic Social Teaching: Solidarity

Solidarity and Communion are intrinsic to our Catholic faith. Family, Community, Church, Social responsibility are all Part of our Christian discipleship. Every time we come to Mass, we receive Holy Communion, which is both a deeply personal communion with the Lord, and also Communion with one another., the body of Christ. The Communion we share is a sign of what all people are called to, in recognising each other as brothers and sisters, and the responsibility we have for one another, especially those in most need.

The first reading today tells us of the God of our ancestors who enters into the history of a suffering people and leads them out of a land of slavery to a land flowing with milk and honey.

The Gospel parable of the fig tree reminds us of God's mercy, while also calling us to repentance from sinful Ways and attitudes, and to see where we can bear fruit as God's people.
