



Caritas Day Report:
Modern Slavery and Trafficking,
from our new
Caritas Plymouth Manager,
Deborah Fisher.


"I attended the modern slavery conference in Plymouth organised by Caritas on 7 March. Human trafficking and modern slavery are, in the words of Pope Francis, 'grievous wounds in the flesh of humanity....in the flesh of Christ himself'.. The event really opened my eyes to the extent of slavery in the UK and overseas and the work that the Catholic Church is doing. I had no idea that around 40 million people are affected worldwide and around 136,000 in the UK.

We had some great presentations from Bishop Mark, the Medaille Trust, Stella Maris (Apostleship of the Sea) and the Border Force.

The Medaille Trust talked about their 4Ps approach: Prevention; Protection; Prosecution and Partnerships. The Trust operate safe houses in the UK where they work with victims of modern slavery to help them recover and rebuild their lives. They could do much more with more resources.

I hadn't appreciated how much Stella Maris do on our behalf. Around a third of all seafarers are Catholic and the organisation works to reach the most vulnerable through a network of over 1000

port chaplains. The Life at Sea report sets out the great work they do but how much more is needed to help a group often hidden from sight. https://www.apostleshipofthesea.org.uk/life-sea-report

Border Force talked about how people are now seen as a commodity and that victims of forced labour or trafficking may also be victims of debt bondage. Victims may be offered a job abroad with "free" transportation, or they may borrow money from the employer for the travel and a job finding fee. Once they have arrived, they then find the job either does not exist or is not what was originally offered and are trapped trying to pay off the debt.



We also discussed what we can do to help – we can pray for those affected by modern slavery; support Caritas and its partner charities through campaigning and fundraising; look out for the signs that someone may be a victim of modern slavery and report our concerns (the CAB has some great advice on how to approach this:

We can buy fairly traded goods or purchase from companies which have a modern slavery policy in place.

Every action can make a difference!"
