Dear Parishioners

Happy Feast day on this Solemnity of Pentecost. This is the day on which on receiving the Holy Spirit the apostles began to go out and proclaim the good news. On that first day alone, 3,000 became disciples on hearing the preaching of St Peter.

In the past few weeks social media has proved a real boon in sharing our faith among ourselves and perhaps, to some degree, in the wider community. For those who are connected, we have been able to join in prayer for Mass and have daily reflections on YouTube. There have been 'virtual' gatherings for Deacon Richard's Scripture group, a Taize evening, and so on.

There is so much more we can, and hope, to do. Our parish is part of a bid from the diocese for grant funding to support our digital efforts. But, whether or not we are successful in that bid, this is something we really ought to develop further. Given the long distances and the ageprofile of our parish, it would be a real benefit, especially for the sick and housebound, and those who will be prevented from attending Mass for some time to come.

We will need to help and encourage those who are not already connected, so that they can participate too. There are many possibilities: Live-streaming Masses, Funerals, Baptisms, Weddings for those who cannot attend, prayer and social gatherings, catechesis, parish council meetings, bereavement support.

Of course, nothing replaces the experience of being physically together; for Mass and the Sacraments this is crucial; and for other gatherings it is preferable. But it would provide us with so many more possibilities and opportunities; and an alternative to those who just cannot physically attend.

On this feast of Pentecost, we pray that the Holy Spirit fill our hearts, enkindle in us the fire of His love, and help us share our faith in every way we can.

#### Pentecost Sunday Reflection By Deacon Richard

Both the Jewish and Christian Faiths celebrate Pentecost, though not for the same reasons. With the Feast of Passover and the Feast of Tabernacles, Pentecost was one of the major feasts of the Chosen People. During these Jewish festivals, every male Jew living within twenty miles of Jerusalem was legally bound to go



to Jerusalem to participate in the feast. The Greek word *pentecostes* means "fiftieth." The feast received this name because it was celebrated fifty days after the Feast of Passover. Originally, this feast was a thanksgiving festival for the completion of the harvest. During Passover, the first *omer* (a Hebrew measure of about a bushel), of barley was offered to God. At Pentecost, two loaves of bread were offered in gratitude for the harvest. Later, the Jews added to the Feast of Pentecost the element of Yahweh's Covenant with Noah, which took place fifty days after the great deluge. Still later, they made this feast an occasion to thank God for His Covenant with Moses, which occurred fifty days after the beginning of the Exodus from Egypt.

For Christians, Pentecost marks the end and the goal of the Easter season. It is a memorial of the day the Holy Spirit descended on the apostles and the Virgin Mary in the form of fiery tongues, an event that took place fifty days after the Resurrection of Jesus. The Paschal mystery -- the Passion, the Death, the Resurrection, and the Ascension of Jesus -- culminates in the sending of the Holy Spirit by the Father (at the request of His Son), on Jesus' disciples. The feast also commemorates the official inauguration of the Christian Church with the apostolic preaching of St. Peter, which resulted in the conversion of 3000 Jews to the Christian Faith.

Today's Scripture readings remind us that Pentecost is an event of both the past and the present. The main theme of today's readings is that the gift of the Holy Spirit is something to be shared with others. In other words, the readings remind us that the gift of the Holy Spirit moves its recipients to action and inspires them to share this gift with others.
