Reflection for the Fourteenth Sunday in OT: Year A By Fr Kevin

The prophet Zechariah unveils a future time when a messianic king will visit and unify his people and the civilized world from the Mediterranean Sea to the Persian Gulf. He will come with humility and power riding on a donkey. But the donkey is not an expression of the king's humility but rather his peaceful intent. The horse was the mount of war the donkey was used for solemn but friendly occasions.

If this description puts you in mind of Palm Sunday, you are right. Matthew uses part of Zechariah's text in his description of Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem. 'Tell the daughter of Zion, behold your king is coming to you, humble and mounted on an ass, and on a colt, the foal of an ass' (See chapter 21 verse 5).

And Jesus picks up this theme of humility in the Gospel when he tells his disciples: '*I am gentle and humble in heart*', Jesus is in the midst of a difficult time in his ministry (read chapters eleven and twelve). So he seems to create a little oasis with his disciples and begins with a prayer of praise acknowledging that his Father is the one true God '*Lord of heaven* and *earth*' and that as the unique son of the Father, God is present in him.

So if we are to learn about God it will be through Jesus and that learning will not be dependent upon whether we are clever or wise but on whether we know our need for God. And, If we know our need for God, then Jesus will teach us and that learning will bring us a deep sense of peace in the depths of being.

But being open to God is a life's work and for that we need the prompting and guidance of the Holy Spirit to which Paul alludes strongly in the brief passage of his letter to the Romans. And we need to be aware that the Spirit which resides in us is the same Spirit which raised Jesus from the dead. So we need to learn and learn again to cast ourselves on the mercy and love of Jesus and listen to his words in the power of the Holy Spirit
