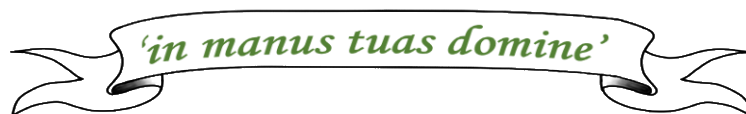

## Reflection for the Fifteenth Sunday in OT: Year A

Today's Gospel relates how the disciples were becoming dejected because of the opposition that Jesus was experiencing in his mission. He had been banned from preaching in the synagogue, ridiculed by the Pharisees and the people were more interested in witnessing another miracle than in truly listening to His Word.

We also can become dejected with the state of our world and even with the state of the church. We may try to live our Christian lives the best we can, beset by a dismissive culture around us, constrained by COVID-19 from our usual mass and communion, upset and appalled by scandal within the church. Sometimes we may feel cast adrift, ineffective, just 'plain tired'.

But Jesus tells us to trust in the Lord. He acknowledges the difficulties of life and uses the parable of the sower to encourage us. Just like the early disciples we cannot and must not expect that, although we know Jesus is the Way, the Truth and the Life, the world will stop in its tracks and listen. But what we must do is persevere because the seed of the Word will land on some fertile soil and take root.

The prophet Isaiah tells of God's promise to the exiles from Babylon that He would not only lead them to a place of plenty and safety but that He would also give them spiritual sustenance. As we slowly find ways to take part in the Mass in community let us pray for the grace to sustain our spiritual life and to continue our mission – *preach the Good News by the way we live.*
