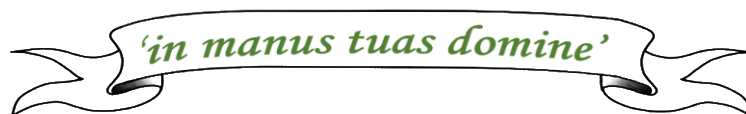

**Reflection for the Eighteenth Sunday in OT: Year A**

In today's reading from Romans 9:1-5 we reach the section in which Paul wrestles with the problem of the place of Israel in salvation history. Israel's rejection of Jesus as Messiah was a shock to Paul, Romans 9:11, and he used very strong words in praying for their salvation.

In the gospel today Matthew has taken over the walking on the water from Mark, there are two major changes, the addition of the dialogue between Peter and Jesus, this story now ends in a confession of Peter's own faith, **'truly you are the Son of God'**. The boat represents the church, and the storm, the persecution through which Matthew's own community is going through.

Jesus appears and now challenges Peter and the disciples to trust in him, when Peter is overcome by fear and calls out **'Lord save me'**, Jesus reply of **'oh you of little faith'**, Peter is saved by Jesus and it is at this point that Peter and the other disciples make that adoring confession **'truly he is the son of God'**.

The question for each of us today is, do we have the courage to step out of safety on to the water of God's turbulent purposes, trusting only on the call of Jesus.

Jesus comes and rebukes us today at times for our lack of trust and faith, but He is also the one who will encourage each of us in that time of doubt, to put our trust in Him. It is Jesus who will answer our prayer and calm the storm in our lives and bring us to safety.

**Father you hear us when we call on you, may each of us be always sensitive to your voice and walk forever in your presence. Amen**

*'Let us let ourselves be led, then; let us not attempt to do more than that which (Mary) wills or more quickly. Let us let ourselves be carried by her; she will think of everything and take care of all our needs, of the soul and of the body. Let us give every difficulty, every sorrow to her, and have confidence that she will take care of it better than we could. Peace then, peace, much peace in an unlimited confidence in her... ..Above all, never let yourselves be troubled, never be frightened, never fear anything. The Immaculate, in fact, is she perhaps not aware of everything? If this was not the case, it would really be a problem.'*
