Message from Fr John

'1st September marked the beginning of the Season of Creation. Pope Francis speaks about the importance of equality and sharing of goods in order to reflect God's love for us and for Creation during this time of trial caused by the pandemic. Pope Francis opened his catechesis by inviting the faithful to "welcome the gift of hope that comes from Christ", especially during the pandemic, in which "many risk losing hope". Children are a great source of hope for us all in the Church as in the world, and we pray this week for our schools as they have just returned to begin a new term and a new academic year. In praying for the children, we pray also for the staff and all who are involved in the governance of schools.

As we enter into Autumn, please do not drop your guard on social distancing and the other guidance we follow. Particularly, do ensure that you wear a face covering from the time you enter into church until the time you leave. However, as you process forward for Holy Communion please ensure your face covering is removed from your mouth so that you can receive as reverently as possible. At the moment, though not ideal, parishioners receive Holy Communion at the end of our Masses and need to leave the church immediately afterwards. The reason we do this is that all 3 of our churches only have one aisle, so we are unable to have parishioners going up and back in the aisle, while maintaining social distancing. Please do keep a time of thanksgiving and prayer, as soon as you are able, given that it is not possible to stay in the church.

I will be taking a couple of week's leave, mainly to visit family and friends I haven't seen since the beginning of lockdown. I am delighted to say that Canon David Annear is covering for me. Faces light up as soon as I mention he is coming back! However, please read the newsletter very carefully as there will not be Masses every day while I am away. So do **check whether there is weekday Mass, and at what time!** We are all feeling rather frustrated by the ongoing pandemic, and the restrictions and guidelines we must follow. Please God they all help keep/get the virus under control as soon as possible so that we can return to more worthy celebration of Masses.

Further in the newsletter is a prayer I published near the beginning of the lockdown. It is the prayer of Pope Francis and is as appropriate now as it was then.'

Season of Creation 1st September to 4th October 2020

'The urgent challenge to protect our common home includes a concern to bring the whole human family together to seek a sustainable and integral development, for we know that things can change. The Creator does not abandon us; he never forsakes his loving plan or repents of having created us. Humanity still has the ability to work together in building our common home'

Laudato Si

1st September is World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation and marks the start of the Season of Creation – an opportunity for us all to reflect on how we care for our Common Home. The Season runs until 4th October – the Feast Day of St Francis of Assisi.

In his message for 'Laudato Si' week, Bishop Mark said:

'Our earth is the home for the human family. It is in severe danger and needs immediate protection and healing at a global, national, and local level.....The threatened state of the environment is a universal challenge affecting us all, those most in danger at present, and in the future, are those who are already poor and vulnerable.....'Laudato Si' is permeated by a sense of human, moral and religious urgency, but the Pope recognizes the complexity of the joining of the environment and poverty. "We are not faced", he says, "with two separate crises, one environmental and the other social but rather with one complex crisis which is both social and environmental"

The current pandemic has highlighted the inequalities which exist in our own country and its various communities and also the huge inequalities in the world between rich and poor. We must recognise opportunities to rebuild in a better way. After the pandemic, a greener, more environmentally friendly future is possible. Making care for the poor, the most disadvantaged in our society and in the world a priority, is possible.

We invite everyone to reflect, to pray, and to act, so that we achieve that ecological conversion that the Holy Father calls us to. You can find resources to use during the Season on the <u>Diocesan Website</u> and Facebook pages.
