Due to restrictions, there will be no Carols preceding the Masses this year.

After having considered a booking system for our 5 Christmas Masses in the parish, it now seems that such a system will create more problems than it solves. **Therefore**, it would be recommended, given the very restricted capacity in all of our churches due to social distancing, that you arrive in very good time for Mass. Once the churches (and hall, in Launceston) are full the stewards will not be able to let any parishioners or visitors in. It is a challenging situation to be in, but there is no choice.

Alternatively, please make use of the **Christmas Octave**. If you attend Mass during the week after Christmas Day, you will, in fact, be attending a Christmas Mass. Fr John will be celebrating Mass in the parish every day in the Octave, apart from Monday.

Again, a big thank you to stewards, cleaners and volunteers whose work enables our churches to remain open during this time of Covid. We are all hoping and praying that they will only be required to carry out these roles until the Spring.

A reminder that the stewards are doing their work with my authority and putting into practice what our bishops, and the government are telling us to do to keep our churches open, with Naomi co-ordinating. The stewards know the routine so please follow their guidance and do what they say, especially over the Christmas period. That way we can gather for Mass and keep our communities safe.

#### When should I set up the Christmas Crib?



Following a beautiful tradition, many families set up their Crib immediately after the Feast of the Immaculate Conception (last Tuesday), as if to relive with Mary those days full of trepidation that preceded the birth of Jesus. Putting up the Crib at home can be a simple but effective way of presenting faith, to pass it on to one's children. The Crib helps us contemplate the mystery of God's love that was revealed in the poverty and simplicity of the Bethlehem Grotto. St Francis of Assisi was so taken by the mystery of the Incarnation that he

wanted to present it anew at Greccio in the living Nativity scene, thus beginning an old, popular tradition that still retains its value for evangelization today.

Indeed, the Crib can help us understand the secret of the true Christmas because it speaks of the humility and merciful goodness of Christ, who "**though he was rich he made himself poor**" for us. (2 Cor: 8:9)

#### Blessing at home for a Christmas Crib.

The leader can be a parent, or any family member. All make the sign of the cross as the leader says: **Our help is in the name of the Lord.** 

R/. Who made heaven and earth.

One of those present or the leader reads a text of sacred Scripture, for example: Luke 2:1 (lines 1-8) or Isaiah 7:10 (lines 10-15, the birth of Emmanuel). **Reader:** The Gospel of the Lord. **R**/. Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ.

The leader prays with hands joined:

God of every nation and people, from the very beginning of creation you have made manifest your love: when our need for a Saviour was great you sent your Son to be born of the Virgin Mary. To our lives he brings joy and peace, justice, mercy, and love.

Lord,

bless all who look upon this manger; may it remind us of the humble birth of Jesus, and raise our thoughts to him, who is God-with-us and Saviour of all, and who lives and reigns forever and ever, Amen
