Monday is the Memorial of **St Josephine Bakhita**. She has a fascinating story, very relevant to our times. Exploring her story would be a good way of honouring her. She is Patron Saint of victims of modern slavery and human trafficking. The Caritas event, **Welcoming the Stranger**, is being held on Monday because it is St Josephine's feast day.

Thursday, Memorial of Our Lady of Lourdes, is **World Day of Prayer for the Sick.** This day carries special significance this year as we consider the many who have been affected by Covid, directly or indirectly. We remember also our sick, housebound and shielding parishioners. We pray for doctors, nurses, carers, and all who look after the sick and the dying; may they bring Christ's love and compassion to all whom they care for.
