#### Day of Prayer for the Victims and Survivors of Abuse – 4th May 2021

Every country has been asked by the Holy Father and the Pontifical Council for the Protection of Minors to identify a date for remembering and praying for victims and survivors of abuse. This year it will be on **Tuesday 4th May**, and Mass here will be offered for this intention. Let us continue to pray and support the listening to, and the healing of, these individuals.

#### Message from Fr John:

**May 17<sup>th</sup>:** The changes that came about on April 12th didn't make a great deal of difference to what we were able to do as parishes or how we could do it. The changes which are due to come in on May 17th will make a difference. They will allow groups of up to six people to meet indoors again. This means it might be an appropriate time for extraordinary ministers of holy communion to resume taking communion to the housebound. As the Sunday after May 17th is Pentecost Sunday, it seems a good time to recommission extraordinary ministers. It would also seem a good time to have special blessings for those who read at Mass and those who organise them. What do you think? I will need to put something in the newsletter if we go ahead.

Attached to the newsletter this week is a **message from the Bishops** Conference of England and Wales. It reflects on some of the things that have been happening in the church over the past 12 months and looks ahead, with hope, as restrictions are gradually being eased.

The bishops commend the missionary and social outreach of the church that has developed significantly over this time. Caritas Plymouth supports and helps develop the social outreach of the Church in our diocese. Its most recently published newsletter is also attached this week. The **Feast of the English Martyrs** falls this Tuesday, 4<sup>th</sup> May, the date on which a small group of Religious and priests were executed in 1535. The group of 5 included Richard Reynolds, whose memorial we celebrate on Wednesday. Richard is a local saint and martyr, born in Pinhoe, Exeter. Our Launceston church was originally dedicated to the English Martyrs. 2 of them are depicted in our stained-glass windows, John Fisher and Thomas More. When Cuthbert Mayne was canonised, he became the patron of our church. He too, is one of the English martyrs.

It is a joy to see **more parishioners returning to Church**. The vaccines have helped give parishioners more confidence although some of you, understandably, are still being cautious. Please, God, as more restrictions are eased by the Government, we look forward to the time when we can remove face masks, fill our churches, sing, welcome visitors, visit the sick more regularly, and give more fitting praise to God and service of His people.

We had a taste of life with less restrictions as we celebrated **Mass outside in the sunshin**e at St Cuthbert Mayne last Sunday. No requirement to wear facemasks. We even had a little congregational singing, along with the birds chirping in the nearby trees. If the weather stays fine, we will do the same this coming Sunday.
