SPUC Pro-Life Chain 2021

On **Saturday 29 May**, between 11.00am and 1.00pm, the Society for the Protection of Unborn Children (SPUC) is holding a silent act of witness, the Pro-life Chain, to commemorate 53 years of legalised abortion and to call for at-home DIY abortions to end immediately.

The Chain will be taking place at Truckle Valley, Camelford, near the BP Garage, on the A39. Prolifers will hold placards with messages which draw attention to the truth and reality of abortion, which will be witnessed by passing motorists. The placards also advertise a post-abortion counselling helpline which offers help and support to anyone suffering in the aftermath of an abortion experience.
