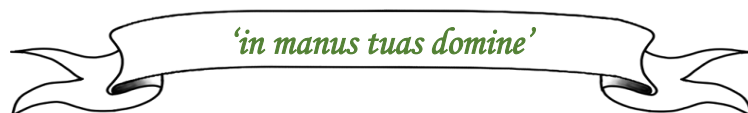

Mass of Creation

Sunday 5th September 2021

Sunday 5th September 2021 is the date of this year's '**Mass of Creation**' and we're planning something rather special within the parish.

We are going to use it as both a celebration of creation and a celebration of community and we have some special events planned. The main celebration will take place **at St Cuthbert Mayne**, purely for logistical reasons, where we are going to gather to praise the Lord in our celebration of Mass when the youth will be especially involved. We will be arranging for our **young people to carry out all the ministries** that day. Partly this is a celebration of our inclusive Catholic community but also to try and create a deeper sense of engagement among the young people of our parish.

As we were unable to mark the occasion of our children's **First Holy Communion** outside of Mass last year, we are going to involve these children with a **tree planting** after Mass – it is hoped that this will become an annual event and can create a real lasting, living, growing testament to the youth of the parish and will, again, help them feel truly rooted within the parish.

The final event of the day, and the one we hope everyone will be able to become involved with, is a **shared parish lunch** where we ask everyone attending to bring something they have created. Please don't think we're suggesting you have to be an artisan baker but we would encourage everyone to bring something they have personally made, e.g. not shop bought sandwiches. We would like this to happen as it keeps with our creation theme and also it links with the live simply ideas that are put forward and encouraged by the Holy Father in Laudato Si.

We would love to decorate the Church with flowers grown by our Parishioners in their gardens. If you would like to bring flowers, they would need to be at St Cuthbert Mayne by 11am Saturday 4th September for the team to arrange them.
