

World Mission Sunday – the one day in the year when the entire global Church comes together in support of mission – will happen on 24<sup>th</sup> October 2021.

World Mission Sunday is celebrated in every Catholic community in the world. It's a moment of grace to express solidarity with our brothers and sisters in Christ who are living in situations of poverty, violence and oppression.

The theme that Pope Francis has chosen for this year's World Mission Sunday is 'We cannot but speak about what we have seen and heard', words spoken by St John and St Peter in the Acts of the Apostles (4:20).

We are reminded by the Holy Father in his letter for World Mission Sunday that 'to be on mission is to be willing to think as Christ does, to believe with him that those around us are also my brothers and sisters. May his compassionate love touch our hears and make us all true missionary disciples'.

## Environmental Grant – ideas please...

As you know we have been enormously helped with grant funding for our building & sound systems at St Cuthbert Mayne church.

Further the Holy Father, Pope Francis has made a priority of developing our Catholic understanding of how our Care for Creation is a vital part of Catholic Social Teaching.

Here in the UK, we will host the COP26 UN Conference on Climate Change from 1st – 12th November; the Government is looking to facilitate lasting environmental change action as a result. To that end they are **funding a new Grant Scheme, allocating £1,000 - £10,000 grants to local organisation to support true grass-roots initiatives.** Local churches like us can benefit as can many other community organisations.

The grants have some important criteria attached; the two most critical ones are: -

- The initiatives must be community led and have real community support i.e., not just dreamt up to get funding
- They must have lasting environmental impact

They can be very simple and wide-ranging, some examples might be re-wilding gardens, cemeteries, or other spaces, providing EV charging points, providing secure cycle storage to encourage cycle journeys, gathering rainwater for irrigation and so on.

## I, therefore, put two challenges to you: -

- Can you identify any projects that any or all of our three communities could undertake, that would provide a basis for a grant application?
- Can you put together a team to plan, develop and implement the idea?
