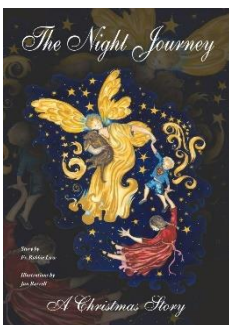
JOURNEY TO 2030
