

### **Feedback from Week Two- Mission:**

#### **Bude**

- My mission is to share the knowledge and love of God with others and to lead by example.: to pass on my faith to family and friends.
- As teachers, a couple of us had opportunity to foster the faith in the young.
- Perseverance is needed in spreading the faith in a gentle manner but not to be afraid to speak up for one's beliefs.
- I should pray constantly for those without faith. I find spiritual sustenance through prayer, the mass and the sacraments. Remote access(video etc) can help those unable to attend the church.
- Our mission as a parish community is to be open about our beliefs, engaging with other Christians where possible. We could do more to engage with the younger generation, particularly in our schools.
- The mission of the whole church is to promote/foster God's love for mankind by engaging with all members of society-- the poor, the lost, the lonely, the outcasts etc.

### Feedback from Week Two - Mission: Launceston

- Mission is to live a life of Faith and prayer.
- To develop belief in Jesus through Our Lady with the Holy Spirit.
- Frequent the Sacraments as much as possible and to keep the commandments.
- Our Parish should support one another in our journey of Faith and be a witness to the local community of our joint belief in the Salvation available to all. We should encourage all people to develop a relationship with God through the Catholic Church.
- The whole Church has the same mission as the local one.
- Prayer is the key to growth in evangelisation. Personal prayer and communal prayer. The message of the Saints is very important in this.
- To evangelise we must deepen our personal faith and prayer otherwise we will just be merely a social group, a worldly group with a worldly mission.
- There is a concern that we may 'lose our gold' if the Church adapts too much to contemporary thinking/worship.
- Concern at what is meant by Pope Francis 'changes.'
- We should be more interactive. Catholics do not attend Churches Together services.
- We do not evangelise easily; we should break out of our mould.
- Every church in our town has a banner 'try praying', not ours.
- Faith is important to all Churches, but there are common elements to be shared.
- We should be seen to be reaching out to others by actions such as the Shoebox gift appeal from the Samaritans. A website benefit scheme.
- In order to begin our mission, we need to listen then carry forward.
- We should be going out by setting an example.
- There used to be a Bible Society, we used to have more opportunities to meet others.
- In countries such as on the African continent, people would go out to socialise more, and religious affiliation was more evident.
- There were times that Catholics would take part in gatherings with other churches but would then not set foot in another church. (CoE)
- Even in 'Catholic countries' (Poland) 90% are Baptised, only 30% continue to practice.
- Mission is created by inner feeling, then go out to evangelise.
- We need to support the Missions financially and with prayer. We should pray 'how do I go out?'
- Christmas is sometimes represented in our secular society (nativity) the baby Jesus, but never at Easter. (The crucifixion)
- The young are not given RE at school but are given an understanding of multi faith beliefs.
- In the street/at school, you get a better response by asking the right question ie not what about faith but 'what is the purpose of your life?'
- We are comfortable in our Church; we do not spread the word. Why when ours is the true church?
- Talk---use words if necessary. Even just smile and say hello.
- Today there is risk of offence, we live in a very PC world. An approach may not be well received.
- People today tend not to think. Philosophising has gone out of the western world- people think about Tesco shopping- not deeply. But when you are dying, or your child is very sick **then** people think deeply.
- Evangelism comes from adoration. Heal yourself, then inspire. The Holy Spirit guides – what do I say next?
- In Cornwall there is suspicion about Catholics from our history and passed from generation to generation.
- Asking about faith often elicits the answer 'why do I need faith, what for?'
