### Feedback from Week Three- Celebrate: Bude

- 1) I celebrate the presence of God by
  - a) participating fully in the liturgy and private prayer and the joy of receiving communion,
  - b) by participating fully in other ceremonies and sacraments of the Church.
  - c) by reading the Bible prayerfully.
  - d) by the singing of hymns when possible-(beautiful words and melodies deepen emotions.The liturgy format may be the same but the prayers and readings focus the mind and heart and the sermons are more "targeted".
- 2) Many parishioners carry out various roles in the services and the running of the parish. All parishioners are encouraged to take part fully in services including hymn singing, readings etc.  
As Catholics, we should make ourselves known more in the town and surrounding area. No "on site" priest doesn't help nor the lack of a Catholic school or institutions in the district. We also feel the lack of a Function Room.  
We need to be more involved in Churches Together events and take a more active part in faith events e.g. Good Friday Walk of Witness. Etc
- 3) The wider church celebrates and promotes journeying together by holding services and events for the participation of everyone, also by being involved with teaching the young and with charities and good works.

### Feedback from Week Three – Celebrate: Launceston

- We celebrate the presence of God through silent prayer and recited prayers and sometimes in petition, but mainly through the entrustment of all we have to the Blessed Virgin Mary.
- Our Parish comes together primarily at Holy Mass on Sundays but also during the week with public Rosary and Exposition.
- Journeying together is done through a prayerful attitude and belief in the Holy Eucharist which is the source of all Unity for we are all one in Christ.
- Prayer leads to understanding God's thinking, not ours. The two are not always in sync. Prayer is 'the hard work'.
- Hearing leads to accepting. We share a journey through prayer.
- People are welcome, not excluded. Catechists, RICA, Legion of Mary.
- Encounter is prayer. Prepare before Mass- readings-study early beforehand.
- Try to focus on the Eucharist. We also have the Rosary and Exposition.
- There is a Polish focus group to train to undertake evangelisation.
- Prayer is important throughout the day; to focus on the day. Prayer changes one.
- Prayer feeds into everything we do.
- I was cross before I found the Lord, now joyful and peaceful. I listen to find the right path and am given inner strength.
- Do we engage with the Mass in a deep sense? Do we engage outside of Mass on Sunday?
- Celebrate-Fulfilment of our gifts. Be aware of the gifts we have, therefore celebrate because they are God given.
- People have died for their faith.
- We do not always recognise our gifts; therefore, can we celebrate?
- Acceptance that we may not have gifts.
- Singing intensifies our understanding.
- Ask others not 'what is your faith?' but 'what do you want of your life?'
- Exposition: not all are called. Do we understand? If we comprehend the presence of the Blessed Sacrament, we have a responsibility to accept, that we are last and the servants of all.
- By celebrate do we understand this to be the method of practice of our faith?
- Practice respect in receiving the Eucharist and other Sacraments.
- Our Church should be a place of sanctity and quiet and treated as such.
- Belief is a process. Some ask, 'is it worth my time?' Do we join in?
- You cannot find things on your own, you need prayer and the help of others.
- Continue learning, teaching is crucial. We all stumble.
- Polish formation group-study, then share.
