

We pray the World Youth Day in Lisbon will help young people to live and witness the Gospel in their own lives.




Steve Riedlinger, Community Outreach, for Aid to the Church in Need (ACN) will be visiting the parish on 5th and 6th August.

Transfiguration of the Lord



Pope Francis speaks of the "beauty" shown in Sunday's Gospel reading of Matthew 17:1–9. In this passage, Peter and James and his brother John witness Christ "transfigured before them" with his face shining "like the sun" and his clothes "dazzling white" as he conversed with Moses and Elijah on the top of a mountain.

Pope Francis said that we must "see the same beauty on the faces of the people who walk beside us every day," such as family, friends, and colleagues. "How many luminous faces, how many smiles, how many wrinkles, how many tears and scars reveal love around us," the pope said. "Let us learn to recognize them and to fill our hearts with them. And then let us set out in order to bring the light we have received to others as well, through concrete acts of love diving into our daily occupations

more generously, loving, serving, and forgiving with greater earnestness and willingness," the Holy Father said. "The contemplation of God's wonders, the contemplation of God's face, of the Lord's face, must move us to the service of others.

Charles Langdon Room

Church hall at St Cuthbert Mayne

Barbeque: A belated thank you to all who made the BBQ, to celebrate the blessing of the Charles Langdon Room (parish hall), such a joyful occasion, bringing the community together. The weather was also kind to us. Particular thanks to John and Clare Ashdown, and Andrew and Hannah Caddon for organising, buying and cooking food, etc., and Marie who always produces lovely food on these occasions.

The newly Refurbished Hall:

For those who were unable to attend the blessing, here is a summary of what Fr John said regarding the changes to the hall. He also thanked a number of people who were particularly involved, including Peter Hazard, Clare, Marcin and Lee.

The hall, known as the Charles Langdon room, was first opened in 2008. A terrific effort by those involved in converting what was a very large presbytery, into a church hall for the parish, and a smaller and more appropriate accommodation for the priest. 15 years later, 2023, the hall was due for a major refurbishment, and some basic changes.

The parish office was moved into what had been the kitchen. Clare, the secretary, is now in a space of her own, a larger office, and can be accessed separately from the presbytery. The presbytery, too, can be accessed separately.

The kitchen was brought out into the open, making it more accessible to everyone.



To install the new lighting meant that much of the ceiling had to be lowered. The new system of lighting gives much more variety. Most of the light fittings are flush with the ceiling, giving a sense of more space in the hall. There is lighting suitable for every occasion. It can be bright for example, for the gathering of women sewers who come here once a month, or warm and gentle lighting, for an evening of prayer. And everything in between.



The pictures on the wall were donated by Valerie Williams. She had brought them back all framed up, several years ago, from a Padre Pio pilgrimage in Italy and donated them to Fr John. They are verses of St Francis of Assisi's Canticle of the Sun. In these days when we need to think a lot about Care for God's Creation, they are so appropriate.

The TV on the wall, means we can include people on Zoom for meetings, which we did for our last PPC meeting, which in this geographically large parish is very useful. We can also use it for watching appropriate films and religious talks, as well as for social occasions.

The crucifix. We have a funeral at Our Lady of Victories on Wednesday of Ursula Corcoran (may she RIP). Her niece, Yvonne, donated Ursula's crucifix. I thought it was likely to be just what we needed for the hall, although the figure looked worn and dull. Pamela took it away and worked her creative magic on it, wrapped the figure in gold leaf, and it looks great.

And the whole place was redecorated and generally updated.
