An Easter Message from Fr John

At Easter it will be wonderful to be singing our Alleluias and Glorias once again, our churches beautifully decorated with flowers, after our Lenten Season of grace, culminating in the Sacred Triduum. Thanks again to all who help make it a worthy celebration of the central mysteries of our faith.

As requested by Pope Francis, in preparation for the Jubilee Year 2025, and as part of our parish Lenten journey, we have been exploring in our 3 communities the great Constitutions of the Church from the Second Vatican Council, finishing with 'Gaudium et Spes', 'Joy and Hope'.

This is a key document in Catholic Social Teaching. Its introduction says it all: The joys and the hopes, the griefs and the anxieties of the people of our time, especially those who are poor or in any way afflicted, these are the joys and hopes, the griefs and anxieties of the followers of Christ. It beautifully expresses how, as the Church, we live not apart from the world, but in dialogue with it. In solidarity with the human community, especially those who are afflicted or suffering in any way. And that the concerns of human beings are our concerns.

The Church is a leaven, a sacrament in the world, a seed of hope, solidarity, and friendship.

In this regard I make special mention of Caritas Diocese of Plymouth. Caritas was set up in this diocese by (Arch)bishop Mark in 2019. It supports the network of social action charities and parishes within the Plymouth Diocese, working in partnership with them to help poor, vulnerable and marginalised people. Caritas is also the Diocesan lead for environmental issues.

There is so much good work already going on through our parishes, schools, and charities to support the poor and vulnerable. And this work will be an even more important focus as we approach the Jubilee Year: Pilgrims of Hope.

Some of the themes for the Jubilee Year include: Care for creation, Food poverty, Modern slavery, Managing debt, Forgiveness, Rest.

May God bless you all and your families and may our Holy Week and Easter celebrations renew our faith, strengthen our hope, and inspire us to share with joy the love of God we receive with open hearts.

Pilgrimage to Buckfast Abbey

We are planning a coach trip/pilgrimage to Buckfast Abbey in the summer. We are looking at the week of the 15^{th} July leaving Bude at 9am (then stopping at Launceston and Callington), returning to Bude around 5:30pm. Cost of coach will be £15 per person. We will visit the Abbey Church, and grounds, celebrate Mass, have lunch at the Grange, and visit the Exhibition Centre.
