In Gaza, people are dying of hunger and disease, as well as injuries caused by the conflict. Food and clean water are desperately scarce. Ninety per cent of the population are displaced, and more than 42,000 people have been killed. There is no safe place for people in Gaza to go.

In Lebanon, over 1 million people have had to leave their homes due to the conflict. Shelters are overwhelmed, and hospitals are struggling to treat the thousands of people

This Sunday is the Eighth world day of the Poor. In his [message for this World Day of the Poor](#), the Holy Father reiterates that "*the poor hold a privileged place in God's heart*" and invites everyone to learn to pray for the poor and to pray together with the poor, with humility and trust.

We know that poverty is a significant issue both in the UK and globally. In the week running up to World Day of the Poor, we are all encouraged to pray, reflect and engage in concrete actions against poverty by deepening our encounter with the poor in our communities and considering how we can respond to their needs. We can all take small actions that together make a big difference.

Assisted Dying Bill

Some serious concerns: Assisted suicide could pressure the most vulnerable, including the elderly and disabled, to end their lives, feeling they are a burden. Legalisation might normalise assisted suicide, shifting it from a right to an expected duty for those who feel burdensome.

Legalisation could undermine palliative care, with lethal injection seen as cheaper and easier than caring for the terminally ill, undermining the UK's leadership in compassionate end-of-life care. Such a law would place medical staff in a morally compromising position, shifting their role from caregivers to participants in ending life. The relationship between medical staff and patients would fundamentally change.

Once legalised, euthanasia laws expand to include more groups, as seen in Canada, where 5% of deaths now result from lethal injection. 'Safeguards' are not to be trusted.

For Catholics, human life is sacred and protecting it from conception to natural death is a core belief. While the Church understands the desperation that may lead some to suicide, it holds that life is a gift, and purposely ending it prematurely is a grave act against God and humanity.
