Parish Pilgrimage

Crediton and Dorchester



On Wednesday 16 July a group of 34 Parishioners from the three churches at Launceston, Bude and Callington set off on a Pilgrimage of Hope for the Jubilee Year, Jubilee passports at the ready for stamping at the Holy sites.



First of all, we visited the beautiful Church of St Boniface at Crediton. We received a wonderful welcome and a short talk about the church, and Daniel Fitzgerald spoke to us about St Boniface who was born in Crediton in about 675AD. He led Anglo-Saxon Missions to Germany and became Archbishop of Mainz before his persecution and martyrdom in Dokkum, Netherlands in 754 AD. We also saw the Anglican church of the Holy Cross which was originally a cathedral and stands on the site of a Saxon church where St Boniface is likely to

have worshipped. They also hold St Boniface in high regard. He is also the patron saint of Devon, and the church is the starting point of the St Boniface Pilgrim Way.

After a picnic lunch break near Chideock, significant because of its association with the Dorset martyrs and the Arundell family - stalwarts of the Catholic Faith during the years of Catholic persecution at the time of the Reformation, and subsequent reign of Elizabeth I through to the 17th century. We continued to Dorchester where Canon John, our host Fr Babu, Father Kevin and Deacon Jonathan De'Kretzer celebrated Mass which was lovely. We then had an amazing talk by one of the Parishioners on The Dorset Martyrs and were taken to the very sobering Elizabeth Frink statues on Gallows Hill. They show two of the martyrs with their executioner.



We are free to keep our faith because of the courage and sacrifice of men like these. It was a spiritual and uplifting day for everyone as well as being very enjoyable. The day ended with a refreshing cup of tea and cake in the parish rooms before we set off for home.
