World Day of Prayer for Grandparents and the Elderly

Sunday 27th July

This Sunday we celebrate the Fifth World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly. Instituted in 2021 by Pope Francis, this special day is rapidly becoming a cherished tradition, highlighting the vital role of older generations within the life of the Church and society.

The theme for this year's celebration, *"Blessed are those who have not lost hope"* (cf. Sir 14:2), draws inspiration from the Jubilee of Hope, and places the elderly not only at the heart of pastoral concern but also as *witnesses of hope and protagonists of ecclesial life*. In his Message for the Day, Pope Leo XIV reflected deeply on the spiritual significance of the elderly, writing:

"God teaches us that, in his eyes, old age is a time of blessing and grace, and that the elderly are, for him, the first witnesses of hope... Everyone, always, can love and pray... In this way, we will be signs of hope, whatever our age."

The Holy Father emphasized the importance of reaching out to elderly people who are lonely or forgotten, noting that visiting them becomes a true "pilgrimage to Christ" and an act that can obtain the Jubilee Indulgence during this Holy Year.
