Each year the Church marks the World Day of Migrants & Refugees, which falls this year on Sunday 5<sup>th</sup> October. For millions of people, migration is not a choice but a necessity. War, persecution, political instability, and increasingly the effects of climate change force people to leave their homes in search of safety and stability.

On their journeys they often face uncertainty, marginalisation and even hostility. And yet, Pope Francis and Pope Leo remind us, the very act of moving forward in hope is itself a witness of courage and faith. **Migrants bring not only their struggles but also their gifts - enriching host communities and calling all of us to deeper solidarity. Migrants truly are missionaries of hope - and through them, we are also called to be missionaries of hope.**
