Ash Wednesday (18th February): No Mass at Our Lady of Victories

This year there will be Mass in Launceston at 10am and Bude at 5pm but there will be no Mass in Callington. Alternative Masses are 10am at Our Lady of The Angels, Saltash or 11am at Our Lady of the Assumption and St Mary Magdalene in Tavistock.

Stations of the Cross

The **Stations of the Cross** is a holy devotion held in each church during Lent. They will be held at:

- **St Peter's Church** at 9:30am on Wednesday morning before Mass, **starting on 25th February.**
- **Our Lady of Victories Church** at 10am on Friday morning starting on Friday 27th February.
- **St Cuthbert Mayne** they will take place on Saturday morning at 10:30am

24 Hours for the Lord

On Saturday 28th – Sunday 29th March there will be a **24 Hour Vigil** at St Cuthbert Mayne Church with Mass, exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, Stations of the Cross, times for prayer and plenty of opportunity for confession throughout. This will begin with Mass on Saturday at 10:30am and finishing with Mass on Sunday at 10:30am

There are one-hour slots if you are able to sign up for watching for an hour. If you would like to lead prayers, meditations or music you are welcome to offer that too, please speak to Fr John. A Rota will be available in the back of Church from this weekend.
