Street Pastors in Callington

Callington is suffering from an increasing anti-social behaviour problem. The town council are very concerned about this and at recent meetings Martin Bunkum, the pastor at the Mustard Seed Church and chaplain to the town council, shared some of his experiences when He was a Street pastor. Jo the town clerk has asked Martin if there would be anyone within the churches who may be willing to be a part of such a project. It would mean having a team of four Street pastors or Street angels who would patrol the streets of Callington during the hours of 17.00hrs and 21.00hrs, possibly once a fortnight. At the same time, it would also have a team of people who were specifically praying for the team.

Full training would be provided and anyone interested or needing further information should give their names to Fr John or Tom White. Churches Together in Callington would manage the project and be supported by the Town council.

Sunday Missals at Our Lady of Victories – now available

Since the new translation of the Lectionary was introduced last year, we have continued to use the old Parish Mass books with the old translation. This is not sustainable and constantly causes confusion.

A generous benefactor has covered the cost of new missals for all who want one at Our Lady of Victories in Callington.
